OER in Higher Education

The ongoing pandemic has had a huge impact on the way education is imparted to the learners. Academicians continue to look for digital resources that can be used freely in the teaching-learning process. It is here that Open Educational Resources, more commonly known as OER, come to the rescue of the teachers. It is estimated that the cost of higher education will come down by 85% if we make OER available to the learners. These can be developed/translated in many languages. MIT's OCW (Open Courseware) is a very well-known project.

As per UNESCO definition, OER are "teaching, learning and research materials in any medium, digital or otherwise, that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions" (UNESCO, 2012).

This online workshop will help participants explore the concept of OER, understand the need and importance of various licenses/copyrights associated with the OERs. They will also be able to find quality OER from the plethora of resources on the Internet. ICT tools, that are freely available on the Internet, can be used by instructors to design and develop their own OER.

We invite you to Engage-Experience-Empower yourselves by participating in this one-week online FDP which will not only help you explore the world of OER but also to create OERs.

SNDT Women's University is a **106-year-old** women's university established by the well-known social reformer, Bharat Ratna-Awardee Maharshi Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve, which is the first women's university in South-East Asia.

In a century of its existence, its enrolment has increased from 5 women of who graduated in the first batch in 2021 to 30000+ women students enrolled in 37 postgraduate departments, 12 conducted colleges, 3 autonomous colleges, 4 institutes and 4 centres on its four campuses alongwith 201 affiliated colleges in 7 states.

The university is accredited with Grade A by NAAC in 2016.

Presently, the University offers 53 undergraduate, 62 postgraduate, 41 doctoral level and several certificate programmes.

Department of Educational Technology

Department of Educational Technology (DET) was established with substantial financial support from the UGC in the year 1973. DET offers a Master programme (M.A./M.Sc. eLearning), as well as Ph.D. Programme in Educational Technology. It also offers 4-credit Online Courses in the relevant fields.

Apart from offering these programmes, DET conducts research, undertakes development activities. DET has so far developed eContent of about 600 learning hours in collaboration with Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Ltd. (MKCL), Community Aid and Sponsorship Programme (CASP, an International NGO), Central Institute of Educational Technology (CIET-NCERT), State Institute of Educational Technology (SIET), Maharashtra, Ministry of Education (NMEICT and TLC), UGC, etc.

DET is actively involved in training of faculty in higher education for more than two decades.

The PMMMNTT is a Central Sector Scheme with All-India coverage.
